There are now only 10 days to the show and the school is beginning to buzz in preparation. The students are completing their in-school entries and the staff are backing work to ensure it is ready to go.

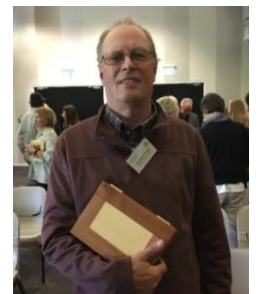
The School Association is still looking for volunteers to help in either the canteen or the gazebo so please return your form if you haven't already done so.

Handy Information Cards to keep in your wallet or glovebox

- Park SAFELY off the road
- CHECK it for signs of life
- REMOVE the animal from the road
- CHECK any pouch for babies

If you find injured or orphaned wildlife



- Keep the animal WARM
- Keep the animal DARK
- Keep the animal QUIET
- DO NOT FEED it anything
